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Foreword

Development of the Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) Standards has been necessitated by the need for establishing requirements governing quality of training services in the TVET sector. It is envisaged that through standardization, service delivery disparities that are encountered when services are rendered within the TVET sector will be removed.

Technical and Vocational Education and Training Authority (TVETA) has established a Technical Standards Committee mandated to develop standards through consultations with stakeholders and Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS). The Committee is composed of representatives from the TVETA Standards Development Department, public and private sector organizations in the TVET sector.

TVET Standards are developed through a Technical Committee in consultation with key stakeholders and professional experts representing government, regulatory and professional bodies, curricula development and assessment agencies, academia, consumer groups, public and private colleges, universities and other interested parties.

Draft TVET Standards are circulated to stakeholders. The comments received are discussed and incorporated before finalization of the standards, in accordance with the principles and procedures for development of training Standards. Once finalized, the public are then notified through Government gazette.

TVET Standards are subject to review from time to time. Users of the TVET Standards are therefore expected to ensure that they always have the latest versions of the standards they are implementing.

Attention is drawn to the possibility that some of the elements of this document may be subject to patent rights. TVETA shall not be held responsible for identifying any or all such patent rights.

Introduction

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TVET Standard — Admission in TVET Programmes — Requirements and guidelines

1 Scope

This TVET Standard prescribes requirements and guidelines applicable to TVET institutions and TVET trainees placement agency. Further, applicable to curriculum developers in prescribing entry behaviour for specific curriculum. QALs when registering trainees for competence assessment for qualification certification. It will also apply to cases of occasional trainees' inter-institution and interdepartmental Transfer.

3 Terms definitions and abbreviations

For the purposes of this document, the following terms, definitions and abbreviations apply.

3.1 Terms and definitions

3.1.1

Bridging course

a short course intensive remedial course designed for admitted trainees/students who do not fulfil the minimum academic entry requirements to enter a particular programme

3.1.2

Deferment

refers to the procedures that allow trainees to postpone their admission or studies for a given time/period due to valid and justifiable reasons with an intention of resuming at a later date.

3.1.2

entry requirements (admission requirements)

refer to the criteria or qualifications a trainee needs to meet to be considered for and accepted into a specific TVET programme or institution

3.1.3

Discontinuation

refers to the formal termination of a trainee's enrolment from a TVET institution

3.1.4

Re-admission

focuses on the procedures that govern the return of trainees who had previously deferred or were discontinued from a TVET institution

3.1.5

Revocation

refers to formal cancellation or withdrawal of trainee's acceptance into a specific education program

4. Governance of admission to TVET programmes

4.1 General

4.1.1 Trainees shall be admitted to TVET institutions accredited by TVETA.

4.1.2 List of all registered TVET institutions and respective training programmes shall be accessed in the TVETA Website.

4.1.3 An accredited TVET institution shall maintain a list of approved training programmes in their website as per the issued TVETA training license.

4.1.4 TVET institution shall file with TVETA its disaggregated enrolment data in the prescribed format .

4.2 TVET programmes admission requirement

4.2.1 Minimum Entry requirements

4.2.1.1 The entry requirement shall promote fairness, accessibility, and alignment with the Kenya National Qualifications Framework (KNQF) while recognizing both formal and informal learning pathways.

4.2.1.2 Minimum entry requirements for every TVET programme shall be provided in line with:

- a) Kenya National Qualification Framework ;
- b) Gazetted TVET regulatory standards and guidelines; and
- c) Professional regulatory bodies guidelines, where they exist.

4.2.1.3 TVET programme subject clusters for minimum entry requirements shall be set up in line Professional regulatory guidelines where applicable.

4.2.1.4 Admission to the specific TVET programme shall be open to all persons who have met minimum requirements in accordance with Annex A.

4.2.1.5 A TVET institution may admit trainees of a minimum age limit of 13 years and in compliance with Employment Act CAP 226 and Industrial Training Act CAP 237.

4.2.2 Entry Through Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)

4.2.2.1 For individuals who have acquired knowledge and skills through informal, non-formal, or experiential learning, admission shall be granted through the RPL pathway.

4.2.2.2 RPL shall be conducted in accordance with TVETS 02.

4.2.2.3 Successful RPL candidates shall be admitted into a programme level subject to attainment of entry requirements as per KNQF.

4.2.3 Credit Transfers

4.2.3.1 Credit transfers shall be accepted for purposes of trainee progression and recognition of prior learning in line with the National KCATS.

4.2.3.2 Credit transfers shall only be accepted from accredited institutions and programmes;

4.2.3.3 A TVET institution shall document internal procedures and guidelines for credit transfer in line with National KCATS standard.

4.2.3.4 Credit transfers shall be permitted up to a maximum of 49% of the core course units for similar programmes at the same level.

4.3 Admissions Committee

4.3.1 The Head of a TVET institution shall

- a) Constitute the institutional Admissions Committee that comprises of:

- i. Deputy Principal

- ii. Registrar,

- iii. Dean of students,

- iv. Heads of respective academic departments,

- v. Quality Assurance officer.

- b) Appoint Deputy Principal to be the chair and the Registrar to be the secretary of the Admissions Committee.

4.3.2 The roles of the institutional Admissions Committee shall be determined by the appointing authority and include but not limited to:

- a) verifying and confirming the minimum admission requirements as specified in the respective regulations and competency-based curriculum for the various TVET programmes;
- b) submitting them to the institutions governing body (Council or Board of Governors) for approval;
- c) Publishing the approved minimum admission requirements on various platforms.
- d) Verifying and evaluating all the received applications against set criteria.
- e) Recommending applicants for approval by the institution's governing body
- f) Communicating to applicants and respective academic departments.
- g) Resolve admission disputes;
- h) Revoking admissions; and
- i) Maintaining admissions records.

4.4 Institutional admission Policy

4.4.1 A TVET institution shall develop institutional admission policy that shall address issues that include but not limited to:

- a) Eligibility criteria
- b) Application process
- c) Selection criteria
- d) Verification criteria
- e) Notification of admission
- f) Confidentiality and data protection
- g) Registration and enrolment
- h) Deferment
- i) Discontinuation
- j) Re-admission
- k) Appeal and grievances
- l) Clearance
- m) Internal / external transfers
- n) Policy implementation
- o) Policy Review

4.4.2 The admission policy shall

- a) Align with relevant existing national policy and regulatory requirements.
- b) promote inclusivity in terms of gender, disability, vulnerable, and disadvantaged group.

5. TVET admission process

5.1 Mode of application

Admission for TVET programmes shall be based on application through:

- a) Kenya Universities and College Central Placement Services (KUCCPS); or
- b) Directly applying to TVET institution.

5.2 Selection process

A TVET institution shall

- a) conduct selection of applicants as per programme eligibility requirements.
- b) ensure equity in selection of applicants regardless of gender, disability, ethnicity, religion, or economic status.
- c) notify applicants of their admission.

5.3 Registration

5.3.1 Registration of trainees shall be carried out at the beginning of each training period.

5.3.2 Trainees shall be required to submit the official letter of offer of Admission together with the certified copies of academic certificates and testimonials at the time of registration.

- a) The name of a trainee shall be as it appears in the national Identification card or Passport where there is conflict, in the same way as they appear in the certificates of national examinations.
- b) The same names shall appear and be used in the same order in all official records and in the final certificates.

5.4 Admission Requirements for Foreign Trainees

5.4.1 A foreign trainee seeking admission into a TVET institution shall be required to provide the following:

- i. Admission letter from the respective TVET institution;
- ii. A copy of the applicant's valid national passport;
- iii. Evidence of academic Qualifications including:
 - a) Certified copies of academic certificates and transcripts.
 - b) Letter of recognition and equation from TVETA for foreign qualification(s).
- iv. Proof of proficiency in English;
- v. Proof of sufficient funds to cover tuition and living expenses.

- vi. Medical clearance
- vii. Valid health insurance coverage for the duration of training.

5.4.2 Upon receiving the admission letter, trainee shall apply for a Student Pass, which is mandatory for all foreign students studying in Kenya, as prescribed by the Directorate of Immigration Services.

5.4.3 All documents in foreign languages shall be translated into English by the respective Embassy, a Public Notary, or an authorized/recognized institution.

5.5 Admission to the KS-TVET

5.5.1 A trainee shall be eligible for admission if he/she holds a minimum qualification of KNQF level 5 or its equivalent

5.5.2 Applications for admission shall be submitted in accordance with the procedures and requirements set out by the Kenya School of TVET.

5.6 Admission Records

5.6.1 A TVET institution shall maintain admission registry containing but not limited to the following records for each trainee:

- a) An application form submitted by the applicant;
- b) A duly filled and signed admission form as prescribed by the institution;
- c) Academic Documents including:
 - i) Certified Copies of Academic Transcripts and Certificates,
 - ii) Letter of Equation and Recognition for foreign qualifications.
- d) Medical Records including:
 - i) A recent medical report form completed by a licensed medical practitioner.
 - ii) Disability Identification Card for PWDs
 - iii) valid health insurance cover.
- e) Personal Identification Documents including:
 - i) National Identification Card and/or Birth Certificate
 - ii) Valid Passport for International Trainees.
- f) Biographical Data.
- g) Recent colored passport-size photographs.
- h) Fees payment records
- i) Consent and Commitment Forms:
 - i) A signed document where the trainee agrees to abide by the institution's rules and regulations.
 - ii) Signed consent from a parent or guardian for trainees under the age of 18.

5.6.2 TVET Institution shall maintain a centralized and secure system for managing trainees' admission records, ensuring compliance with the Data Protection Act.

5.7 Trainee induction

A TVET Institution shall induct trainees on admission in areas that include but not limited to:

- a) Institution's mission, vision and core values
- b) Rules and regulations
- c) Career development advisory
- d) Available trainee support services that include scholarships, guidance and counselling, support for PWDs and mentorship programs.
- e) Institution's training methodologies and course structure
- f) Assessment and certifications of the course
- g) Academic progression

5.8 Multicultural Support in Admission

To promote cultural diversity, equity, and inclusion in admissions, a TVET institution may:

- a) Design admission outreach that targets minority or marginalized communities.
- b) Avail basic admission information in English, Kiswahili, and local languages where needed
- c) Allow for translated admission materials (application forms, brochures, interview guides).
- d) Offer placement or bridging courses for applicants with limited proficiency in the language of instruction.
- e) Allow alternative documentation for applicants from conflict areas such as affidavits or community verification.

6. Trainee Transfer

A TVET institution shall establish intra-institutional and inter-institutional trainee transfer guidelines.

6.1 Intra-Institutional Transfers

A TVET institution shall approve intra-institutional transfers based on:

- a) Eligibility of the trainee
- b) Credit transfers requirements where applicable
- c) Availability of a vacancy based on TVETA approved enrolment for the programme of interest.

6.2 Inter-institutional transfers

6.2.1 A trainee seeking inter-institutional transfer shall obtain a letter of acceptance from the receiving institution.

6.2.2 A releasing TVET institution shall:

- a) approve inter-institutional transfers if a recipient institution is accredited.

- b) Verify that the target programme is comparable in content, level, and credit hours
- c) Provide a trainee with official academic transcripts and relevant documentation.

6.2.3 The receiving institution shall:

- a) Verify the trainee's academic records.
- b) Award credit transfers where applicable.
- c) Admit trainee into the requested programme.
- d) Communicate trainee's transfer to KUCCPS as applicable.

Note: A trainee should not be transferred during the examination/assessment period.

6.3 Transfer Appeals

A TVET institution shall put in place mechanisms to address transfer appeals.

7. Deferment

7.1 Eligibility for deferment

7.1.1 A trainee may apply for deferment if he/she is unable to continue with their studies due to but not limited to:

- i. Medical conditions supported by a certified medical practitioner
- ii. Financial hardship
- iii. Family or personal emergencies
- iv. Employment obligations for working trainees.
- v. National service or civic duty
- vi. Other exceptional circumstances deemed acceptable by the institution

7.1.2 A trainee shall not be eligible for a deferment due to personal convenience or dissatisfaction with a programme.

7.2 Duration of deferment

A TVET institution shall:

- i. Determine deferment duration depending on the course availability at the level of deferment.
- ii. Determine extension of deferment period, after which the trainee shall have to reapply afresh.
- iii. Set the maximum number of deferments after which the trainee shall reapply afresh for the programme.

7.3 Application Process for deferment

7.3.1 A trainee shall apply for deferment before the start of the training period.

NOTE: Deferment request after commencement of training may be considered under exceptional circumstances.

7.3.2 A trainee shall submit a formal request that shall include;

- a) Reason for deferment
- b) Proposed deferment period indicating start and ending date
- c) Supporting documentation

7.3.3 TVET institution shall

- a) assess the validity of the submitted request and supporting documents for approval.
- b) communicate the decision to the trainee's request for deferment in writing. This may include;
 - i) Approved deferment - The trainee shall be informed of the new start date or the continuation of the programme after the deferment period.
 - ii) Denied Deferment -The trainee may be allowed to appeal or directed to alternative solutions

NOTE: Academic progress made before the deferment shall remain valid.

8. Discontinuation

8.1 Institutional discontinuation procedure

A TVET institution shall develop institutional discontinuation procedure that shall address issues that include but not limited to:

- a) Issuance of warning notice to a trainee at risk of discontinuation outlining the reasons.
- b) conduct an investigation
- c) Approval of discontinuation cases
- d) appeal mechanisms
- e) re-admission

8.2 Grounds for discontinuation(involuntary)

TVET institution shall discontinue a trainee from a given programme due to but not limited to the following:

- a) falsification of academic records
- b) Failure to meet the minimum training standards.
- c) Disciplinary issue.

8.3 Grounds for discontinuation (Voluntary)

A trainee may discontinue from a training programme due to but not limited to the following:

- i. Change in career path
- ii. Transfer to another institution
- iii. Family responsibility
- iv. Personal health or safety related ground

- v. Financial constrains

Note The institution may offer exit counselling.

9 Trainee Re-admission

A TVET institution shall allow for re-admission of the deferred and discontinued trainee as per institutional re-admission procedures.

10. Quality Assurance

10.1 Internal quality assurance

10.1.1 A TVET institution shall establish, mainstream and institutionalize internal quality assurance mechanisms for admissions.

10.1.2 The institution's IQA committee shall conduct regular quality audits on implementation of admission policy

10.1.3 The institution shall prepare and disseminate internal quality audit reports.

10.2 External Quality Assurance

10.2.1 External quality assurance shall be conducted by TVETA and professional regulatory bodies where applicable.

10.2.2 External quality audit reports shall be prepared and disseminated to stakeholders.
